Now to him who is able to accomplish far more than all we ask or imagine, by the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Lord Jesus, we believe. Help our unbelief and make your home in our hearts. As we gaze upon your cross and adore you in your sacrament, let us understand as Paul did that you loved us and gave yourself for us!

Her privilege is the highest fruit of the Redemption and our consoling assurance of the coming of our final hope – the glorification which is Christ.
